

Support for special needs in the Erasmus + program

Erasmus + pays special attention to guidance, acceptance, physical accessibility, pedagogical and technical support, and specifically to finance the additional costs of students and staff whose physical, mental or health circumstances are such that their participation in the program would not be possible without additional financial support ("students and staff with special needs"). The purpose is to take full advantage of all the benefits of Erasmus + mobility experience.

By signing the Erasmus Charter in Higher Education (ECHE), each higher education institution commits itself to ensuring equal access and opportunities to participants from all over the world and all the statuses. In this way, students and staff with special needs can use the support services that the receiving institution offers to their home students and staff.

Additional financial support

After choosing a home institution, and before leaving for mobility, you can apply for Erasmus + financial support for students and staff with special needs for your mobility needs. This is an additional financial support in addition to regular Erasmus + student mobility grants for the purpose of study / professional practice or staff mobility. To apply for Erasmus + additional financial support for special needs, you need to specify your needs at the preparatory stage of your Erasmus + Mobility and anticipate additional costs associated with your specific physical, mental or health circumstances.

What are your access needs?

Depending on individual needs, items that are formally eligible for additional financial support during Erasmus + mobility include, inter alia, the following:

- custom accommodation
- travel assistance
- medical care
- additional equipment
- custom teaching materials
- a person accompanying, etc.

How to apply?

Ask the International Cooperation Office or the Erasmus + Coordinator at your home help desk to fill out the application form.

Get in touch with the MapAbility network developed by the Erasmus Student Network (ESN) mapping the accessibility of higher education institutions and their services to make a decision about the destination of your mobility.
